## Write an essay in which you define the word Democracy.

## • Basic Requirements:

- Introduction paragraph with thesis statement (HINT: This thesis statement will propose your definition of the word Democracy.)
- 2-3 body paragraphs that correlate with your thesis statement and support your definition
- A concluding paragraph that reminds me of your key points and effectively argues your definition
- As you write your essay, you must:
  - Focus on defining the concept of Democracy.
  - Effectively organize your ideas using the provided graphic organizer. (A five-paragraph essay is not necessary; however, you do need a definite introduction, body and conclusion.)
  - o Include supporting evidence from our studies of Colonial America and the American Revolution. (This requirement is mandatory and must be fulfilled to earn an A.)
  - o Include ideas from any of the following sources:
    - The dictionary and or personal definition
    - Synonyms and antonyms (compare/contrast)
    - An anecdote
    - Any ideas stimulated by the above quotations
    - Other historical evidence
    - Evidence from relevant literary works (Golding's Lord of the Flies or Orwell's Animal Farm, for example)
  - Include ample and appropriate details.
  - o Edit your essay for standard grammar and language usage.
