





Revolutionary War Era Tick-Tack-Toe

Choose three of the following activities below. You can make a vertical, horizontal, or diagonal line, but the three you choose must be in order. Cross out the activity as you complete it to win tick-tack-toe!

<p>Draw 2 political cartoons showing the events of the Boston Massacre. 1 should show the loyalist perspective and 1 should show the patriot perspective. Your cartoons should be drawn in pen and colored.</p> 	<p>Write a 1 page newspaper article that reports on Patrick Henry's "If This Be Treason" speech. What did he say in his speech and what kind of reaction did it cause?</p> 	<p>Imagine you are an alien visiting from another planet. Write a report to send back to your home planet describing the events of the Boston Tea Party. Make sure you fully describe the strange things you see.</p> 
<p>Imagine you are George Washington. Write a 1 page letter to your troops after you are named Commander of the Revolutionary Army. What do you want your troops to know about you?</p> 	<p>Imagine you are a major motion picture director. Draw a story board that depicts the causes of the Revolutionary War. You don't have to include all of the causes, just include the ones you want your audience to remember. Your story board must have at least 7 frames.</p> 	<p>Imagine you are Samuel Adams writing for the Committees of Correspondence. Draft a 1 page letter to send to Virginia describing the Intolerable Acts.</p> 
<p>Imagine you are a Boston shopkeeper. Write a 1 page diary entry that expresses your feelings about the Boston Tea Party.</p> 	<p>Write some kind of lyrical prose (song, rap, cheer) that discusses the main ideas of Thomas Paine's "Common Sense".</p> 	<p>Write a 1 page editorial (opinion piece) from either the Loyalist or Patriot perspective that shows your feelings about King George III. Make sure you identify yourself as either a Loyalist or Patriot.</p>
